## Pastor Looks Kierkegaard Man Philosophy

**concept of relationship god-man in kierkegaard s writing ...** - relationship of man to god in connection with man's fall. for a better understanding of the text, we must clarify the time when kierkegaard wrote it. in 1847, kierkegaard dealt with the question of profession: as a rural pastor he personally experienced a calling to serve to god. —for **the crowd is untruth: a comparison of kierkegaard and girard** - stands the pastor, indeed they have a mutual understanding; he dies, the pastor ushers him into eternity for ten rix-dollars—but a self he was not, and a self he did not become.
